PWA is pleased to announce that Murray Jose-Boerbridge, Executive Director, is adopting a second son and will be taking parental leave from approximately mid-October 2016 through mid-July 2017.

As an HIV+ gay man, Murray has shared some of the personal impact and complex emotions of moving into this new period with his family.

*"Parenting has provided me an incredible opportunity for personal, family and community growth in my life. I expect an expanded family will only enhance the deeper self-understanding that comes with seeing the world (and yourself) through the eyes of a child. The joy and curiosity are quite remarkable to share and the innocence of their observations and actions can result in some insightful (and occasionally uncomfortable!) personal insights. Add to this the emotional and psychological shift that was involved when I first entered into a parenting commitment following 22 years of living with HIV and again now, following the 25<sup>th</sup> 'anniversary' this past spring and you begin to get a sense of my gratitude, excitement and yes, nervousness. This is a further opportunity to explore my dreams and live a life that has been very much shaped by HIV but not defined by it. PWA has been a significant part of getting to this point in my journey. Thank you!"*

➤ **Interim Service Access Manager - Rachel Dickson**


